# Prehistory













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
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
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
The Modern Age started when the French Revolution happened.



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







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
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Some people were artisans and others were farmers. They started to exchange the products they made and the crops they cultivated. This was the beginning of **trade**.





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


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
They also made **polished stone tools** which they used to harvest crops and grind cereals into flour. They used larger tools to work the soil and cut down trees.

They also made **figurines** out of stone and bones.






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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
